## IOC / World Aquatics ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

### Compliance with the Olympic Charter and other relevant rules

All athletes must respect and comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors) and Rule 43 (World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of Manipulation of Competitions).

Only those athletes who respect and comply with the Olympic Charter, the World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of the Manipulation of Competitions, including the conditions of participation established by the IOC, plus the rules of World Aquatics, may participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024.

Only the athletes who are eligible to participate at the official World Aquatics competitions, in accordance with the World Aquatics General Rules, are entitled to participate in the Olympic Games.

Only athletes who have participated in the World Aquatics Championships 2023 in Fukuoka (JPN) or in the World Aquatics Championships 2024 Doha (QAT) will be eligible for Universality places. An athlete entering through Universality will be limited to a maximum of up to two Olympic Games in his/her career provided the athlete is not older than the age of thirty (30) as of 31<sup>st</sup> December 2024.

### Time Trials

#### From World Aquatics AQUA Document:

**Time trials may only be held in exceptional circumstances details of which shall be sent to the World Aquatics office as soon as the circumstances are known and before the time trial takes place at the event. Upon receipt of this information, the World Aquatics office will confirm if the time trial is approved for qualification purposes.**

## SAQ Eligibility Guidelines

To be considered for nomination to SNOC for selection, a swimmer must meet all the following eligibility criteria and maintain through the Championships:

1. BL 9.3.6 Swimming The minimum age for swimmers competing in the Olympic Games, FINA World Championships and FINA World Swimming Championships (25m) shall be the same as the minimum age for the FINA World Junior Swimming Championships: Women, 14 years of age, and Men, 15 years of age, on 31st December in the year of competition, except younger Competitors may participate in these competitions if they have achieved at least the "B" Standard Entry Time in the respective event.
2. Be a Singapore citizen, eligible to represent Singapore.
  - a. Athletes should not be holding dual nationality if they are above 22 years old.
3. Be a registered member of SAQ in good standing.
4. Have a signed current SAQ / SNOC Athlete Agreement.
5. Met performance standards as designated by WA, appointed the governing body of these games (Table 1)
  - a. Times must be achieved in an individual event.
    - i. Relay lead-off times, time-trials\*\* and swim-off results will be considered based on **Performance Requirements** priority below.
      1. \*\*Time-Trial exceptions at SAQ meets (World Aquatics)
        - a. NSF Provisions Only
        - b. No other time-trial provisions will be made during SAQ sanctioned meets.
      - ii. Intermediate splits will not be considered for selection purposes.
6. Have competed in one of the above selection events, unless granted an exemption under the provisions of the criteria by the SAQ Selectors. This exemption will only be granted due to extenuating circumstances. On request of SAQ, evidence shall be provided of the extenuating circumstances, prior to the exemption being considered.
  - a. Extenuating circumstances can include but is not limited to:
    - i. Injury or Illness
    - ii. Equipment Failure
    - iii. Travel Delays
    - iv. Bereavement
    - v. Such other circumstances as the selectors may consider to be relevant.

\*\*Time-Trials set up prior to the start of SAQ National Meets and pre-approved by World Aquatics for NS Servicemen not able to take leave to participate in prelims of that event to qualify for finals or compete the day of that event due to NS commitments, are considered regular events and will count toward qualification Priority 1, 3 and 5.

7. Continues to train for, behave and act towards peak swimming performance.
8. Be available to fulfil the Team Commitments as listed below and any additional commitments following selection.
9. Not used or administered any substance which, if it had been detected as being present in the athlete's body tissue or fluids, would have constituted doping, or used any prohibited method or committed any other doping offence as defined in ADS's, WADA or FINA's Anti-Doping By-law.

### SAQ QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

1. All athletes with an Olympic Qualification Time (OQT)
2. Athletes in relays (also referred to as Relay-Only Athletes)
3. Invited athletes who have achieved an Olympic Consideration Time (OCT)
4. Universality Places

Based on the qualification pathway:

- If either gender does not have a OQT or relay selection, NOC to submit request for Universality place for that gender.
- If by 4<sup>th</sup> July that gender does not have OQT, OCT invitation or relay qualifier, NOC will confirm use of universality.
- If reallocation of unused quota results in an OCT invitation on the 5<sup>th</sup> of July, that OCT invitation will take priority over universality.
- SAQ will **NOT** notify any athlete of universality confirmation until such time all OCT invitations are finalised by WA.

## INDIVIDUAL QUALIFICATION

### Olympic Qualifying Time (OQT) and Olympic Consideration Time (OCT)

#### Athletes who have achieved the Olympic Qualifying Time (OQT)

- Athletes who equal or better the OQT in one or more individual events are automatically qualified to participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024, provided that the maximum quota per event for that NOC is not exceeded.
- NOCs can enter two (2) athletes in the same event, only if both athletes have equalled or bettered the OQT.

#### Invited athletes who have achieved an Olympic Consideration Time (OCT)

- While both athletes who qualify via relays and via Universality are next in the priority order after athletes with OQTs, the OCT is addressed here due to its direct relation to the overall quota of 852 athletes in Paris 2024.
- Following the end of the qualification period and in the event that the quota of 852 athletes is not reached after application of the first three categories of paragraph D: Qualification Pathway, World Aquatics will then invite athletes who have equalled or bettered an OCT, until the total quota of 852 athletes is reached.

## SAQ Performance Requirements

To be considered for nomination to SNOC for individual events selection for the 2024 Paris Olympic Games, swimmers are required to:

1. Achieve an OQT Standard as shown below in Table 1. at one of the designated selections meets within the SAQ selection window.
  1. The Automatic Qualifying time is set by WA/IOC for these games.
2. A maximum of two swimmers can be entered per event provided both swimmers meet the OQT Standard. The fastest two swimmers with OQT Standards after the SAQ qualifying period will be selected (according to SAQ individual event selection priority below).
3. Achieve an OST Standard as shown in Table 1. at one of the designated selection meets.
  1. One Swimmer can qualify with an OST Standard provided no swimmers achieve the OQT standard in that event and they are the fastest OST Standard.
    - i. OST Standards set by WA/IOC for this championship are subject to WA/IOC invite based on total meet quota by the IOC.
4. SAQ Individual **Event Selection Priority**
  1. Individual Event OQT
  2. Relay Lead Off, Swim-Off, Time-Trial OQT (Ranked inclusively)
  3. Individual IOC/WA Invited OST
  4. Relay Lead-Off, Swim-off, Time Trial IOC/WA Invited OST (Ranked Inclusively)
  5. IOC Universality
5. Time-Trials during selection meets: WA must pre-approve the use of any time-trials for OG selection purposes prior to racing. The use of timings from Time-Trials is not automatic and at WA discretion. Time-Trials cannot be added ad-hoc during a qualification meet where approval was not already obtained.
6. Should two or more swimmers achieve the same qualifying time at the selection Event then the swimmer's second fastest time (and subsequent times should there continue to be a tie) in that event during the Selection Event will be used to determine which swimmer is selected.
  1. If there continues to be a tie the following times priority will be used
    - i. Time achieved in Finals
    - ii. Time achieved in Semi-Finals
    - iii. Time achieved in Prelims

Nomination for Other Events:

Selection for individual events is decided by IOC/WA and swimmers are eligible only to swim events invited for with exception:

- An invited swimmer with one or more automatic OQT
  - SAQ will nominate swimmers to SNOC in other events they have achieved an OCT provided no other swimmer has achieved the OQT for that event.

## RELAY QUALIFICATION

**There shall be a maximum of sixteen (16) qualified teams in each relay event.**

Three (3) NOCs per relay event shall be qualified for the corresponding relay event at the Olympic Games Paris 2024 based upon the final results achieved in their performances at the World Aquatics World Championships 2023 in Fukuoka.

The remaining thirteen (13) teams per relay event shall be the teams with the fastest times based upon the results achieved in their preliminary heat and finals performances in the World Aquatics Championships 2022 in Fukuoka (JPN) and World Aquatics Championships 2024 in Doha (QAT), excluding those teams already qualified in that event from the World Aquatics Championships 2023 in Fukuoka.

The relay place is allocated to the NOC.

All athletes entered in individual events can be used in relays, even if they have not achieved the OCT for the corresponding stroke and distance of the relay in which they are entered. The NOC may compose its team with additional athletes according to the formula below.

The following formula shall apply:

- One (1) Relay - two (2) additional athletes
- Two (2) Relays - four (4) additional athletes
- Three (3) Relays - six (6) additional athletes
- Four (4) Relays - eight (8) additional athletes
- Five (5) Relays - ten (10) additional athletes
- Six (6) or seven (7) Relays - twelve (12) additional athletes.

If an NOC has a relay team, which has been invited to compete in the Olympic Games Paris 2024, and does not have a sufficient number of qualified (OQT) and invited (OCT) athletes to enable the relay team to participate, notwithstanding the provisions outlined above, World Aquatics Bureau (WAB) may, in its absolute discretion, and on an exceptional basis, offer additional Relay-Only athlete quota places to the NOC for the sole purpose of enabling the relay team to participate in the relevant event.

If an NOC enters Relay-Only Athletes, these athletes must swim either in the heat or final of at least one relay event. Should a Relay-Only Athlete not compete, this will lead to the

## SAQ Criteria for RELAY QUALIFICATION

Criteria for Selection for Relay Events:

***As per IOC / WA Relay Selection process, should Singapore be invited as a top 16 Relay Team in any of the relay events, to further qualify the relay the following will apply:***

- **Relay places are allocated to the NOC by IOC / WA**
- All swimmers entered in individual events are eligible for relays.
- Relay Only Swimmers will be added via the following formula,
  - One (1) Relay - two (2) additional athletes
  - Two (2) Relays - four (4) additional athletes
  - Three (3) Relays - six (6) additional athletes
  - Four (4) Relays - eight (8) additional athletes
  - Five (5) Relays - ten (10) additional athletes
  - Six (6) or seven (7) Relays - twelve (12) additional athletes
- Should an invited relay not have enough qualified OQT and invited OCT athletes to participate, SNOC will request exceptional consideration for additional Relay-Only swimmers for the relay to participate from WAB.
  - If more than one relay falls into this category SAQ will nominate to SNOC relays by the following priority
    - World Ranking as per WA tables from the qualification window.
    - If two or more relays are tied, they will be further ranked as time % from the eighth qualified relay for that relay event.

For the Olympic Games, relay only swimmers must swim the relay they are invited, or the relay is disqualified. The final selection of swimmers to allocated relays is as follows.

1. Swimmers will be ranked in the corresponding distances and strokes for relay events achieved at qualifying selection meets during the selection window, unless:
  - A swimmer renders themselves unavailable for consideration through written communication with the HPT.

Two athletes of the same gender entered via Universality are not permitted.</p> <p>NOCs with no athletes who have achieved an OQT nor any athlete invited by World Aquatics through the OCT may enter a maximum of one (1) man and one (1) woman, provided that those athletes participated in the World Aquatics Championships 2023 Fukuoka (JPN) and/or in the World Aquatics Championships 2024 Doha (QAT).</p> <p>NOCs with athletes having achieved an OQT or invited by World Aquatics through the OCT in one (1) gender only may also enter one (1) universality swimmer in the other gender.</p> <p>Athletes with an OCT achieved (but not invited via the OCT due to the quota being reached) may be invited through Universality Places and may be entered in up to two (2) individual events. Additionally, NOCs are obligated to enter the male athlete and the female athlete who have achieved the highest World Aquatics Points Table score in any individual Olympic event, as achieved at a World Aquatics -approved qualification event during the qualification period, using the World Aquatics Points Table, 1st January 2024 edition. Exceptions will be granted only for circumstances of injury or retirement, with verification by the athlete and after review by World Aquatics, or if there are doping control violations or disciplinary actions against this athlete.

### IOC / WA - Maximum number of athletes per NOC:

### SAQ Team Size

1. SAQ intends to send a maximum 26 swimmers per gender as per SAQ Performance Criteria above.
2. SAQ shall not be obligated to take a full team of two athletes per event should a qualifying athlete not be available for selection.
3. OQT's are automatic whereas OCT invites are selected by IOC/WA only if Quota of athletes allows for it.
4. Universality Places will only be used should there be no OQT, relay or OCT invites from IOC / WA as per Qualification Timeline (Table 2)
5. SAQ submits nominations to SNOC for final selection based on criteria governed by IOC / WA selection procedures.

### SAQ Coaches Selection

- A. The National Head Coach will assume the role of the Head Coach for the 2024 Olympic Games.
  - a. The National Head Coach can assign the role of Head Coach for the Olympic Games if point B allocation of credentials limits slots.
- B. The number of coaches selected will depend on the number of swimmers selected to the meet with a maximum ratio of 1:4 (1 coach x every 4 swimmers), designated by their swimmers qualified to the meet, within the overall allocation of credentials assigned to Swimming from the SNOC Olympic Quota.
- C. The coaches will be selected in accordance to the following priority:
  - 1) Coach of the highest World Ranked swimmer / podium performance opportunity.
  - 2) Number of swimmers that have achieved the individual OQT's.
  - 3) Number of swimmers invited for relay positions.
  - 4) Number of swimmers that have achieved the individual OST.
  - 5) If there are more coaches placing swimmers on the team than the ratio of coaches permits (1 to 4), then a coach priority list will be determined via swimmer's best individual event FINA World Ranking (Sept 1, 2022 – Aug 31, 2023)
- D. The nominated coach of an athlete must be the coach of record for at least 3 months prior to the athlete's selection and current coach into the 2024 Olympic Games

### SAQ

- All swimmers and officials must:
1. Always comply with the provisions of the SNOC Athletes Agreement.

2. Appeals submitted by SAQ to SNOC for consideration of a swimmer **post SNOC team selection.**

The process of appeal is as follows:

- a. SAQ HPM submits the appeal with evidence\* directly to SNOC for review.
- b. SNOC reviews the appeal and corresponds to SAQ the outcome of the appeal.
- c. SAQ corresponds the outcome of the appeal to the club of the said swimmer.
- d. Review and decision of the appeal by SNOC is final.

\*SAQ shall submit an appeal to SNOC on merits warranted by SAQ that serve the desired performance outcomes of the team.
